French Lessons	French language lessons run between September and April
Exam Details	Exams vary greatly from course to course. Students may be asked to complete written exams, submit reports, sit oral exams, or a combination of these. Exams take place at the end of each module. As such there are no specific exam periods.
Minimum Pass Mark for each module	A= Excellent – B= Very Good – C= Good – D= Satisfactory – E= Sufficient - F= Fail. If the student receives a grade 'F' in any module, they cannot pass that module.

Exam re-sits	Students can re-sit exams that they have failed. Arrangements for re-sits vary from course to course.

Necessary insurance	<p>Health Insurance (Sécurité sociale) This cover is to reimburse students for a large part (60%-70%) of any medical costs. Students from the European Economic Area should make sure they have a European Health Insurance Card before travelling abroad. Non-EEA students need to pay different amounts depending on their age</p> <p>Public Liability Insurance This is needed in case the student causes an accident that, for example, injures somebody. It costs around 16 EUR per year.</p> <p>Complimentary health insurance Students are strongly advised to take out extra health insurance in order to complement the Sécurité Sociale (up to almost 100% of medical costs). Prices vary, but expect to pay around 250 EUR.</p>
