3. Additional information

3.1. Grading system

LOCAL GRADE

The local grade at Ecole Centrale de Marseille is a numeric grade from 0 to 20 (classical French system) for most courses. The evaluation is passed if the local grade is equal or greater than 10. Those obtaining passing grades are divided into five subgroups: A outstanding performance, B above the average standard, C generally sound work, D fair but with significant shortcomings, E meets the minimum criteria, FX failed and a small amount of work required before the credit can be awarded, F failed by a large amount.

ECTS GRADE

The ECTS system divides students between pass and fail groups, and then assesses the performance of these two groups separately. Those obtaining passing grades (local grade.10) are divided into five subgroups: the best 10% are awarded an A grade, the next 25% a B grade, the next 30% a C grade, the next 25% a D grade and the last 10% an E grade.

Those who have failed (local grade<10) are divided into two subgroups: local grade<10 and >= 7: FX a small amount of work required before credit can be awarded, and local grade <7: F considerable further work is required.

GPA GRADE

Our GPA system divides students between those for which the local grade is greater than 7 and those for which the local is less than 7 groups, and then assesses the performance of these two groups separately. For an evaluation less than 7, a 0 GPA is given. The second group is divided into 8 subgroups.

3.2. Visa

Our institution will provide assistance, when required, in securing visas for incoming and outgoing students/staff, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
